

Annual Outhodontic Debate 17th April, 2023 SGT University, Gurugram

The Department of Orthodontics, Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University, Gurugram in collaboration with Smile 4 Souls Academic Association conducted the 1st Annual Orthodontic Debate in the country endorsed by IOS. The event was efficiently organised by Dr.Pandurangan Harikrishnan, head of the department and his team of staff and postgraduate students.

Around 80 postgraduate students attended the programme enthuciastically from ten different colleges divided into ten teams from four states (Haryana , Delhi, Rajasthan and U.P.). The programme began with an introductory speech by Dr. P. Harikrishnan highlighting the various topics of controversy right from the historic "Case controversy" debate of 1911, which was followed by the welcome speech by Dr. Santosh Kumar. National Integrated Typhodont workshop was held from 6th – 8th April in association with the Indian Orthodontic Society. The program had the participation of more than 100 delegates from more than 30 different colleges across India. The program lectures were held in R Ahmed hall and the hands on exercises were demonstrated and performed in the Artificial simulation lab. The course participants were provided with course material and a video manual for future reference.

The objective of this three day comprehensive program was to teach various fixed and removable orthodontic techniques and basic wire bending to the post graduate students.

The program saw an array of reputed speakers from different parts of the country coming together to impart their knowledge and skills.

Around 116 participants attended the program

Lecture Content

DAY-1

Dr M.S. Sidhu and Dr Sunanda Roy Choudhary took lecture on Standard Edgewise technique followed by demonstration of different wire bending exercises.

Dr Poonam Sharma, Dr Payal Sharma and Dr Piush Kumar conducted a lecture on Begg's technique followed by demonstration of different Begg's wire bending exercises.

Dr Gurkeerat Singh and Dr Rajkumar Singh gave an overview of Myofunctional and orthopedic appliances followed by demonstration of construction bite technique.

DAY-2

Dr Vinay Chugh and Dr Priyank Rai gave an overview of Pre adjusted edgewise technique, Roth philosophy, MBT technique followed by MBT technique bracket placement.

DAY-3

Dr Sanjay Labh conducted a lecture of lingual orthodontics followed by demonstration and hands on of fabrication of individualized arch form

He also conducted a lecture on self ligation in Orthodontics

Dr Puneet Batra took a lecture on Cleft Orthodontics followed by a demonstration of lip taping and Nasoalveolar molding.

The students were familiarized with different basic orthodontic techniques. They had an opportunity to get a hands on experience of different types of wire bendings in different techniques. Students attained a better understanding of the basics of orthodontic biomechanics.

The lectures were concluded with a felicitation by presenting a memento to the respective speakers and to delegates on the final day of the program




















MYC REPORT Vietnam


The speaker, Dr. Retrouvey, shared his expert in depth knowledge on the importance and significance of 3D open soft wares and how viz-a-

REPORT

In association with The Indian Orthodontic Society, the Department of Orthodontics and Dentofacial Orthopaedics, Mar Baselios Dental College, Kothamangalam, Kerala conducted a two-day workshop on "Impacted Canines: Diagnosis and Management" on March 31st and April 1st, 2023, and saw the participation of 83 delegates. Day 1 began with the registration of the delegates followed by the inaugural ceremony. The inaugural speech was delivered by Dr. P.G. Francis. Other dignitaries on the dais included Dr. Byju Paul Kurian, the Principal of Mar Baselios Dental College, Kothamangalam, and Vice President Mr. Binu Kaipillil. The vote of

thanks was given by Dr. Irin Sebastian and Dr. Arun Bosco J introduced the workshop.

The sessions for the day included presentations on the incidence, etiology, and diagnosis of impacted canines by Dr. Brijesh S, and treatment modalities for impacted canines by Dr. Joseph Sebastian. The morning sessions also covered the open eruption techniques by Dr. Biju Kalarikkal, closed eruption Post-workshop assessments were conducted, followed by a panel discussion moderated by Dr. Joseph Sebastian and involving Dr. P.G. Francis and Dr. Biju Kalarikkal. The delegates were provided with certificates and a course manual and the workshop was concluded with a valedictory function.

The workshop provided valuable insights into the



techniques, and autogenous transplantation of impacted canines by Dr. P.G. Francis. After the lunch break, a live demonstration of surgical exposure techniques – Apically repositioned flap. tunnel traction and autogenous transplantation were conducted.

Day 2, on April 1st, started with hands-on exercises guided by Dr. P.G. Francis, Dr. Biju Kalarikkal, Dr. Joseph Sebastian, Dr. Brijesh S, Dr. Arun Bosco J, and Dr. Irin Sebastian, along with the cooperation of postgraduate students of our department Dr. Nivya Krishna U, Dr. Jupitha Grace Podimon, Dr. Thasnim Jawahar, Dr. Anagha Prasad, Dr. Maria Robin, Dr. Rachna Menon, Dr. Princymol, and Dr. Arjun Krishna. The hands-on exercises included wire bending techniques such as modified Ballista spring, multiloop, Kilroy spring, etc., and different surgical exposure techniques on simulated models.

diagnosis and management of impacted canines, with informative presentations, live demonstrations, and hands-on exercises. The Clinical enrich program was held on 30th April 2023.





Evaluation of stresses and displacement in the craniofacial region as a reaction to bone-anchored maxillary protraction in conjugation with posterior bite plane and rapid maxillary expansion in patients with Class III malocclusion: A finite element analysis study

Introduction: Treating a Class III malocclusion is often challenging for orthodontists. Bone-anchored maxillary protraction (BAMP) is known for achieving a significant maxillary protraction. The study aimed to evaluate the stress distribution and displacement of craniofacial bones as a reaction to the forces of BAMP, along with rapid maxillary expander and the posterior bite plane, in growing patients with skeletal Class III malocclusion using a finite element method. Methods: An finite element model was constructed from the spiral computed tomographic images of a skull from an 11-year-old growing patient with skeletal Class III malocclusion along with BAMP, rapid maxillary expander, and the posterior bite plane. The created model had 105,189 nodes and 481,066 elements. After assigning the appropriate material properties and the boundary condition, 800 g of transverse force per side and a Class III intraoral elastic 250 g of force per side were applied to the model, and after the postprocessing, the results were obtained in the form of color bands. Results: The maxilla and the attached structures were displaced and expanded transversely. The maxilla was displaced anteriorly by 0.692 mm, and the mandible was displaced backward by 0,204 mm in the sagittal direction. The anterior region of the maxilla and mandible, dentition, and nasal bone were rotated counterclockwise. Displacement in an upward direction was greatest at the symphysis region of the mandible. The stresses experienced by most of the bones were tensile, with the maxilla and maxillary dentition experiencing the maximum. Conclusions: Favorable changes were appreciated with maxillary forward and mandibular backward displacement, with appreciable tensile stresses in all the bones. 
