


REMEMBERING THE LEGEND

DR. KEKI MINOCHER MISTRY (1935-2023)







"OUR GENTLE GIANT"

A Tribute to the Man who made Giants out of Men

It is with profound respect and deep reverence that the world of Orthodontics bids farewell to an extraordinary visionary, a revered founding Father of the Indian Orthodontic Society and a towering luminary who left an indelible footprint on the landscape of dentistry in India and beyond.

On September 8, 2023, Dr Keki Minocher Mistry, affectionately known as "Our Gentle Giant," departed from this world. Today, we honour a legacy of boundless compassion, relentless hard work and an unwavering dedication to the highest levels of excellence.

THE BEGINNING



Born on December 25, 1935 in the vibrant city of Mumbai, Dr Mistry took immense pride in his identity as an Indian Zoroastrian Parsi. He had the deepest affection for his motherland and often said, "India is truly our motherland as she has sheltered and nurtured us Parsis as only a mother would."


Ever since he embarked on his

journey in dentistry, Dr Mistry was deeply captivated by the intricate world of Orthodontics and the profound health benefits it could offer. To him Orthodontics transcended mere wire-bending; it represented a profound biological science. Dr Mistry was renowned for his emphatic proclamation, "I am a doctor, not a mere technician."

He passionately believed that in any profession what matters most is one's attitude and a sense of pride in the work one undertakes. When asked what time he leaves for work, he would tongue in cheek reply, "I don't ever go to work ... whatever I do I enjoy thoroughly and I do it because I love it!"

AN ACADEMIC ODYSSEY

Dr Keki Mistry's academic journey began at Bombay



University where he graduated in Dental Surgery in 1957 at the top of his class with distinction in four out of seven subjects, exhibiting early signs of the brilliance that would come to define his illustrious career.

His thirst for knowledge led him to obtain his M as ters in Orthodontics from the University of Illinois, USA (with 2 major distinctions) under the

mentorship of Dr Allan G Brodie.

Recognizing the paramount importance of enhancing oral health in India, he nurtured a strong aspiration to pursue a Master's in public health. However, the demands of his thriving practice rendered full-time study unfeasible. Remarkably, his invaluable contributions in the realm of public health garnered recognition from the University of London, which granted him a special concession on attendance, enabling him to attain another Master's degree (MSc.D) from the University of London.

His unwavering dedication to excellence continued as he went on to achieve a D.D.P.H. in Public Health from the Royal College of Surgeons, UK and Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) from the International Open University at Copenhagen, Denmark.

INDIAN ORTHODONTIC SOCIETY: GENESIS AND JOURNEY

Reflecting upon the genesis of the IOS, Dr Mistry fondly recalls, "One day, Dr Ashok Modi, Dr Naishadh Parikh and myself decided to have coffee at the Kwality Restaurant which was situated in the ground floor of my clinic building. We had come from a meeting of the Bombay Orthodontic Study Group which we had formed earlier. Over steaming cups of coffee, our discussion on showcasing our treated and unfinished cases through various modalities led to a considerable exchange of views. We resolved we must meet more often to discuss ideas and have a meeting of minds. We decided to expand the study group which had been formed earlier with myself as the convenor and Dr

Sanghvi as the co-convener, into a more if not fully representative society. Thus was born the idea of the Indian Orthodontic Society."

FROM 7 TO 7000: AN ENDURING LEGACY

Dr Mistry, Dr Modi and Dr Parikh then approached Dr H. D. Merchant, who at the time served as the Dean and Head of the Department of Orthodontics at Nair Hospital Dental College, and Dr H. S. Sheikh, Head of Orthodontics at Government Dental College in Bombay. They responded enthusiastically and in 1965 along with Dr Prem Prakash





and Dr Mohandas Bhat, this collaborative union marked the birth of the Indian Orthodontic Society.

As more and more esteemed practitioners aligned themselves with the Indian Orthodontic Society (IOS), the organization's reputation and influence grew significantly. Today it stands as the 2nd largest specialised health society in the world with over 7000 members transforming it into a vibrant and enthusiastic community.

An interesting fact is that the founders decided that for the initial decade.

the President of the society would be selected based on seniority of age. At that time, the term of the president of the Indian Orthodontic Society (IOS) was for two years. Dr Mistry, due to his junior age ranking would be sixth on the list. Thus this twist of fate led Dr Mistry to become the First elected president of the IOS.

Today, the prestigious Professor Keki Mistry Scroll of Honour for outstanding contributions in the field of Orthodontics is the most coveted award of the Indian orthodontic Society.

ILLUSTRIOUS CAREER

To describe Dr Keki Mistry as a pioneer in Orthodontics would be an understatement. He was a trailblazer, constantly pushing the boundaries of innovation and embracing new technologies that benefited patients worldwide. At the age of 85, with his legendary farsightedness he grasped the immense potential of

Digital Dentistry and the promising future it represented. He immediately acquired an Itero scanner at the Mistry Centre for Advanced Dentistry, becoming one of the pioneers in India to adopt this cutting-edge technology.

As a Consultant Orthodontist, Dr Mistry held esteemed positions at several distinguished institutions including the Parsee General Hospital, the Jaslok Hospital & Research Centre, the Railway Head Quarters Hospital, and the Bhabha Atomic Energy Commission in Mumbai.

His expertise was also sought after by the Indian Railways, Airlines and the Indian military medical services throughout his illustrious career.

TRANSFORMATIVE LEADERSHIP

In addition to his impressive awards and accolades, Dr Mistry assumed numerous leadership roles in Dentistry and other fields too.

In 1984, Dr Mistry served as the President of the Indian Dental Association (IDA). During his tenure, he had the unique opportunity to introduce and involve the Federation Dentaire International (FDI) and the World Health Organization (WHO) for the first time in India through a pioneering workshop with the IDA.



Furthermore, in 1984, with support from the Indian Medical Council, Indian Dental Council and the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare of the Government of India, Dr Mistry successfully advocated for the declaration of Dental Science posts as Medical Posts instead of non-medical. This significant event had a profound impact on the status of the dental profession in India, the financial compensation of salaried professionals, and the administrative structure within the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare in New Delhi (Office Memorandum No. V12025/17/84-PMS).

Dr Mistry was involved with The Asia Pacific Dental Federation (29 Countries) for over 3 decades. In the words of Dr Oliver Hennedige, Secretary General APDF, "Dr Mistry was one of the most successful Presidents of the APDF and served well in various capacities from Treasurer, Commission Chairman, Organiser of successful dental workshops and then onto the highest post of President APDF/APRO."



In the realm of community service, he held leadership positions with Rotary International including serving as the President of Rotary Club of Bombay North.

A devout Zoroastrian, he revered Sri Sathya Sai baba whose philosophy of 'see good, be good and do good' resonated with the Zoroastrian doctrine of good thoughts, good words and good deeds. Sathya Sai Baba appointed him

Trustee of the Sri Sathya Sai Trust Maharashtra looking after the medical, educational & service activities.

AWARDS AND HONOURS

Dr Mistry was a cherished, esteemed, and widely acknowledged clinician which earned him significant recognition and several national and international awards.

Notable among them is the prestigious Dr B. C. Roy Gold Medal and National Award for his remarkable contributions to medical social work in India. This exalted honour was bestowed upon him by the Hon. Prime Minister of India at the time. His accolades continued to accumulate as he received several other acclaimed awards, such as the Bharat Udyog Award for his dedicated work among industrial workers, the

National Hind Gaurav Award and the Mother India Award for his unwavering commitment to the well-being of children.

Dr. Mistry's influence extended beyond national borders. Internationally, he was the five time recipient of the Asian Pacific Dental Federation Merit Award, the International Distinguished Medical Professionals Award from Cambridge, UK and was honoured with the Doctorate of

Literature due to his extensive work on dental literature and research.

In 1994, he was appointed the expert advisor to the World Health Organization (WHO) in oral health and it was a proud moment for India when the WHO established the concept of Oral Health Day, a notion

conceptualised and fathered by Dr Mistry.

In recognition of his exceptional dedication and tireless efforts, he was honoured with the Lifetime Achievement Award from various prestigious organisation including Indian Orthodontic Society, the Indian Dental Association, the International Dental Students Association and the Famdent Dental Association. In 2019 he was awarded the lifetime achievement award by the World Federation of Orthodontics, the only Indian to be thus honoured!

Along the way, Dr Mistry published 6 professional books, guided independent graduate research and has been the national and international editor of many professional journals with 97 professional and public health publications.

INSPIRATIONAL IDEALOGY

Dr Mistry believed in the potency of resilience and unwavering self-confidence, frequently citing the aphorism, "When the mind is clear and the heart is pure, then there is no fear. March on."



His favourite story at his many orations revolved around the Italian violinist Don Giovanni Paganini, who in the face of adversity with all but one string of his violin broken declared, "Paganini and one string!" He then proceeded to weave one of the most enchanting musical compositions.

"The first string that broke symbolizes our tendency to assign blame to our family members when things go awry. Similarly, the second string represents our friends and colleagues, who may occasionally let us down. The third string signifies our support system – our secretary, technician, and subordinates – which, too, can falter. However, the final string, the one that remained unbroken, symbolizes our indomitable self-confidence."

In the words of Past President of IOS Dr Vijay Jayade,, "Dr Mistry was an excellent orator. It was a treat to listen to his speeches and everyone would listen in rapt attention when he opined on any contentious issue in the annual general body meetings. His command over the English language, measured views and persuasive arguments would win the debate in most instances."


MENTOR PAR EXCELLENCE

Dr Mistry was a much loved professor and mentor. He possessed the unique ability to put his students at ease, alleviating fears and doubts while guiding them towards a confident career in dentistry.

Dr Mistry passion for teaching was evident when he held the position of Professor and Head of Department of Orthodontics at Government Dental College and Hospital, Mumbai.

In a letter to Dr Mistry, Dr P. Wadkar, Professor, Nair Hospital who was conducting the BDS exams of Mumbai University noted, "You come across as an extremely kind hearted, passionate and hospitable person with tons of knowledge, truly the hallmark of a great man. Your persona is reflected in your Department which was absolutely high-class and the right environment to pursue Post Graduate training."

Subsequently he joined the D.Y. Patil University as Director and Dean. He took great joy in imparting to young Orthodontists knowledge coupled with wisdom, sharing his insights and experience with the next generation.



"There is so much to learn from him and his long active career remains an inspiration and encouragement for future generations. His contributions towards society are immense and extend beyond the field of dentistry," remarked Dr Vijay Patil, President DY Patil University.

CELEBRATING A REMARKABLE JOURNEY

In honour of Professor Dr Keki M. Mistry's 80th birthday, a magnificent reception was organized by his students and family. The celebration took place atop the picturesque Trident hotel at Mumbai's Nariman Point. During this commemorative event, Dr Mistry's book titled "OUR GENTLE GIANT" was officially launched. This biographical work chronicles his remarkable 80-year journey and highlights his substantial contributions to the field of dentistry in India and worldwide, as well as his numerous noteworthy endeavours in social service. The book features a foreword penned by Mr Ratan Tata, Chairman of the Tata Group.

A LEGACY CONTINUES

Dr Mistry is survived by Mrs Nargish Mistry, his beloved wife of 58 years. Throughout Dr Mistry's extraordinary journey, she has been his most dedicated and unwavering supporter, standing firmly by his side.

Today his legacy will be carried forward by his three devoted children, Dr. Rushitum, Orthodontist and Implantologist, Dr. Saiesha, Aesthetic and Restorative Dentist and Ms Kainaz Mistry, Clinic Coordinator at the Mistry Centre for Advanced Dentistry.

Alongside them will be the countless professionals who attribute their success to the invaluable guidance and inspiration provided by this extraordinary orthodontist. His indelible mark on the worlds of dentistry and public health, along with his wise sayings and quotes will continue to serve as a source of inspiration for years to come.

We end with the words of Dr Mistry, "When you rise in the morning, let your conviction be that today, you will achieve nothing less than the very best."

The entire Indian Orthodontic Society deeply mourns the passing away of Our Gentle Giant and we pray to the Almighty to let the Noble soul rest in eternal peace.





The Childhood Days...

Dr. Varun Kalra was born in New Delhi. His father was an officer (Doctor) in the Air Force and his postings used to get changed after few years, so while growing up he lived in different parts of India. His parents were fond of traveling and exploring the region of the country where they were posted and he was fortunate to travel along with them. This was at a time when travel for leisure and infra structure for travel was very limited in India. The family travelled to several remote areas and also visited many national parks/ game reserves in different parts of the country. That's how he developed interest for travel, exploration and adventure. When he was in school in New Delhi in the late 1960s, there was a huge influx of hippies in the city and in India, in general. He was enamoured of those hippies & their free lifestyle and wanted to experience some of that life for himself. At that time, the land route from London to Delhi was open and safe. At one point, he planned to hitch hike to Europe right after high school at age 16. However, his parents talked sense into him and asked him to wait until he completed his professional education.

The 'Kalra' in making...

He graduated from Dr. R. Ahmed Dental College (Calcutta) in 1975 and completed his MDS in Orthodontics from KGMC (Lucknow) in the year 1978. Upon completion of MDS, his parents, true to their word and his father, who was very generous by nature, gave him \$1000 out of the \$5000 (which he had just received for his retirement). It was extremely generous of him to give his son 20% of his retirement funds to fulfill his son's whim and fancy to hitch hike & travel in Europe. \$500 was for a return flight to London by Afghan Airlines (cheapest at that time) and \$500 was for him to hitch hike, travel and do odd jobs in Europe until his money ran out completely. Still he was able to find a paid training position in dentistry in U.K. within that time. He flew to London in 1978 and hitchhiked around England & Scotland while he kept applying for positions in dentistry that were posted in the British Dental

Journal after every two weeks. An anecdote that comes to his mind from that time - "I was hitch hiking through England towards Scotland and I had to wait overnight for traffic to start the next morning so I could try and get a ride further towards my destination. I spent the night sitting outside on some steps at the side of a restaurant/cafe because if I sat inside I would have to spend money on a coffee. Although it was late summer, it can get guite cold in the night out in the countryside in England. While I was nodding off on the steps, a group of teenagers decided to walk away with my backpack with all my belongings in it, fortunately I woke up just in time and they dropped it! Not having had much success for about two months in finding a position in England, and with money dwindling, I was planning to take a boat to France, hitch hike around Europe, pick grapes and do odd jobs to pay for my expenses while I was in Europe before returning to settle down in



India. I was set to leave for France on a Monday, but as luck (and perseverance) would have it, I got called for an interview and offered a position as House Officer at the London Hospital Dental School on the Friday prior to it." (sighs happily)

Upon completion of his six month house job, he was fortunate to skip the rank of Senior House Officer and was offered a position as Registrar in Orthodontics at the Children's Hospital in Brighton. The position was recognized by the Royal College of Surgeons, England, for training towards D. Orth RCS. He trained/worked in this position at the hospital in Brighton for four years and obtained his D. Orth RCS in 1983. During this time, he also took the statutory exams and obtained a license to practice in the U.K. After completion of his D. Orth RCS in 1983, he was fortunate to be selected for the three year MSD program in orthodontics with a scholarship at the University of Connecticut, U.S.A.

And the Credit goes to...



The person he is indebted to for advising/steering him into Orthodontics after completing D.D.S. in Calcutta, was Dr. TN Chawla (Head of the Dental Department at KGMC - Lucknow). During post-graduation at KGMC, all of us used to get trained in the Tweed technique with Dr. V.P. Sharma and Dr. D.S. Gupta. In England, he learned the use of the pre adjusted Edgewise system with Dr. Ian Crossman who was his consultant in Brighton. In addition to treating patients with fixed appliances, he treated all types of malocclusions, extraction and non extraction, with removable appliances including different types of Functional appliances. During his four years in Brighton, he would get one day per week to study towards his D Orth. RCS. By special arrangement, he was able to use that day to attend the orthodontic program on Fridays at the Royal Dental Hospital in London under Prof. W.J. Houston. There, amongst other techniques, he also learned the Begg technique and then brought it back to treat some patients with it in Brighton. Dr. Crossman, who also held an MBBS degree, had a special interest in treating early cleft babies born at the Children's Hospital, so he also gained experience in treating babies and children with cleft lip and palate. At the University of Connecticut, he trained with Dr. C.J. Burstone and Dr. Ravi Nanda. Dr. Burstone, is of course,



acclaimed for his pioneering work and contributions in the field of biomechanics and the Segmented Arch Technique. In Connecticut, he was able to assimilate his knowledge of biomechanics and the principles of appliance design. Apart from biomechanics, there was also big emphasis on diagnosis and treatment planning prioritizing the soft tissue facial profile. He used to perform occlusograms and cephalometric VTO's for each patient by hand. There was also a good focus on the study of materials such as the new TMA and NiTi wires.

After completion of MSD at Connecticut, he joined the faculty there as Assistant Professor from the year 1986 to 1988. Thereafter, he moved to Cleveland as Assistant Professor at Case Western Reserve University. While over there, he also earned his DDS. For the last 25 years, he has had a couple of practices and he teaches part time as Clinical Associate Professor at the University of Pittsburgh.

'India' Meri Jaan...

During his stay in England and the first several years while he was in the US, he did not have much professional contact in India. He believes, about twenty five years ago, he reconnected with (Prof.) Dr. O.P. Kharbanda whom he knew from his days of togetherness at KGMC.

Through Dr. Kharbanda got more involved with the Indian Orthodontic Society and lecturing in India, he also has lectured several times in New Delhi and at the annual meetings of IOS - recent one in Bangalore where you are just taking my interview. (laughs out loud with a hand shake)

He has also interacted with graduate students over the years in various programmes in India who have conducted research on some of the appliances he has designed. Having got so much from India, he tries to give back in whatever way he can. He still pretty much visits India once a year.

'Orthodontics' - My soul & spine....

His biggest achievements include being a mentor and role model for students & young orthodontists. He has been teaching at various universities in the U.S. for thirty five years. He also teaches internationally and has given about hundred lectures and courses in about thirty countries. As for appliances he has designed - K-SIR arch wire - This wire is designed to simultaneously intrude and retract the six anterior teeth in first premolar extraction cases while providing excellent molar anchorage. It is indicated for use in severe Class II Div 1 malocclusion with deep overbite or Class I malocclusion with severe bimaxillary protrusion. A controlled study by J. Prabhu in 2001 for his Master's thesis research verified the results achieved with the K-Sir arch wire. There have also been other publications on it.

K-Loop molar distalizing appliance: He primarily uses the K-Loop in a Class II case to distalize Class II molars into a Class I relationship in order to provide room for crowded premolars and/or canines. There have been several studies published on the effects of the K-Loop including a recent FEM study by PD Tekale et. al. in the Journal of the Indian Orthodontic Society in April, 2023.

K-9 spring: The K-9 spring is used to align high, palatally impacted canines. Activation of the spring results in a force on the canine that erupts, it moves it buccally and can also be activated to distalize it - all the movements that are needed initially to bring a high palatally impacted canine into the arch. A recent study by S Verma et. al. published in the Angle Orthodontist in January, 2023 bears out the effectiveness of the K-9 spring.

Some more 'Deep Diving' into Orthodontics...

In deciding whether to extract or to simply expand and flare the teeth to alleviate crowding you have to take into account

- 1. The amount of crowding
- 2. Pre treatment inclination of the teeth
- 3. Facial aesthetics
- 4. Periodontal/alveolar housing and health of the teeth short and long term
- 5. Stability of the result

There are of course, situations where some compromise between these requirements is in the patient's best interest. The alveolar bone on the buccal aspect of the roots is generally very thin and there is no evidence that one can grow alveolar bone on the buccal surfaces of the roots by expansion and flaring. Therefore, excessive widening and flaring of the teeth will tend to move the roots out of the alveolar housing and lead to bone dehiscence or fenestration if one tries to torque the roots buccally/labially in order to mask the proclination. Not to mention lack of stability. Things have come full circle in the extraction debate. In the early days of orthodontics, Edward Angle ordained that all cases be treated non extraction (maybe due to limitations of his earlier appliances). Angle was a very strong personality and one would challenge the dogma of non - extraction at one's peril while he was alive. It was only after his death in 1930 that two of his students, Charles Tweed in the US and Raymond Begg in Australia, who were not happy with the results of non - extraction treatment in some patients, finally presented their rationale for extractions. They and other orthodontists then started treating patients with extractions. Unfortunately, their evaluation to extract or not was based on cephalometric measurements of skeletal and dental criteria without taking the soft tissue profile into consideration. So, even slight variation in incisor inclination was met with extractions and the pendulum swung too far to the side of extractions. leading to many dished in profiles in the 1940's and 1950's. Noting the detrimental effect of extractions on the face of many patients, pioneers such as Steiner, Burstone, Subtelny, Ricketts and others stressed the importance of also taking the soft tissue profile into account before deciding on extractions. I think the next 30-40 years were the golden age of diagnosis and treatment planning in orthodontics, arriving at the decision to extract or not on an



individualized basis taking many hard and soft tissue considerations into account. TADs have been a great addition to the orthodontic armamentarium. Certain tooth movements such as intrusion of buccal segments with orthodontics to correct skeletal open bite were not possible prior to the advent of TADs. In other cases it can deliver better results by providing nearly absolute anchorage while eliminating or minimizing side effects. He uses both inter and extra radicular TADs for various clinical applications.

Clear Aligners: Well, whether one likes it or not, aligners are here to stay and their use is only going to increase because of the ever increasing demand by the public. Obviously, aligners cannot perform certain tooth movements as well as fixed appliances can. Therefore, not all cases are suitable for treatment with aligners. In his practice, aligners are rarely a treatment of first choice and he only uses them on patients that he feels are appropriate for their use. The efficacy of tooth movement and overall treatment with clear aligners has come a long way. One is now able to achieve results with aligners that were not imaginable when they were first introduced. Further advances in technology and concepts in the future are likely to improve their efficacy further. So, the bottom line is that orthodontists should develop skills and experience to treat patients with aligners so that they can use them in appropriate cases.

And to 'Conclude'...

I would say to young orthodontists that they have chosen an excellent profession. In fact, US News & World Report that ranks colleges, professions etc., has ranked Orthodontics as the 'Numero Uno' profession at several times. My best advice would be to use common sense and follow the science and to not blindly follow the so called gurus or brands without sound evidence. Do what is best for your patient. Follow your dream and persevere!




